

Reasons for studying in the UK	% of responder
Standard of the university or college	78%
Standard of the course	73%

I want to permanently stay in the UK	27%
The UK is a safe place to study	27%

Apply 2017 Key facts

Application is entirely online

- Maximum of 5 choices
- Some choice restrictions:
 - Medicine, Veterinary, Dentistry (maximum of 4)
 - Oxford or Cambridge
- Simple application cost:
 - 1 Choice £12
 - 2-5 Choices £23
- Simultaneous consideration
- 'Invisibility'





When to apply

1 September First day for receipt of applications

15 October Medicine, Veterinary and Dentistry





When to apply

15 January Advisory application deadline (UK/EU)

24 March Some art & design courses

30 June Latest date for international applicants

6 sections to complete:

- Personal details
- Choices
- Education
- Employment
- Personal statement
- Referee details

Personal Statement

The only section you have control over

Your only chance to sell yourself as an individual

One Personal Statement for all choices



Max. 4,000 characters

Min. 1,000 characters

No spelling/grammar check

No formatting

Personal Statement

Others may have same grades – helps you stand out Shows university/college Admissions Tutor:

- You're suited to the course
- Motivation and dedication
- Relevant knowledge/experience
- Understand the demands of the course
- You'll fit the university environment



Common errors

Not leaving enough time

Failure to check entry requirements

Qualifications missing, or incorrectly entered



Wrong student support fee code

Forgot admissions test registration

Copied text in personal statement

Using Track

- Access your record online
- Shows choices, offers, personal information
- Allows you to:
 - update personal info
 - Get information about offers
- Also used to:
 - reply to offers
 - Extra,*Clearing,* registering for Adjustment*

Universities' decisions

Universities and colleges will review: You'll get 1 of 3 decisions:

Personal statement
Reference
Qualifications
Admissions test results
Interviews
Portfolios
Auditions

Unconditional offer **Conditional** offer **Unsuccessful**





Firm - If all conditions are met, where you will be **placed**Insurance – Usually lower conditions

Any other offers must be **declined**You don't have to have an **Insurance**



Confirmation of places

Exam results are published and sent to universities and college

Admissions staff check if you've met the conditions of the offer four possible outcomes:

Met the conditions of your Firm
Time to celebrate!

Missed out on your Firm, but met Insurance conditions?

Also time to celebrate!

Not met the conditions of Either. You could still get a Place through Clearing.

Better than expected? You could use **Adjustment** to Change your place.



Other options

Extra (24 Feb-4 July)

Used all 5 choices and had no offers (or declined all offers/withdrew). Add Extra choices for consideration one at a time.






Quick refresh

1	Applicant researches course choices
2	Applicant researches admissions tests, student loans And visa requirements
3	Applicant registers online with UCAS Apply
4	Completes form and processes payment
5	Academic reference added by school
6	Centre / applicant sends form electronically to UCAS
7	UCAS processes form / forwards to universities/colleges
8	They submit decisions (offer or unsuccessful)
9	Applicant views decisions on Track
10	Applicant replies to offers on Track (Firm / Insurance)
11	Place confirmed when results are released
